ITALIAN

Italian 250 A - Rome

Albert Sbragia & Mary O'Neil TTH 12:30-1:50pm & F discussion section at 12:30-1:20pm or 1:30-2:20pm SLN 15226, 5 cr., VLPA/I&S, taught in English Meets with ART H 250 A and HSTEU 250 A

Focuses on Rome as an historical, intellectual, and artistic world center. Literary and historic documents, visual arts, architecture, film, and opera used to explore the changing paradigms of the Eternal City. In English.

Italian 262 A - Dante and the Middle Ages

Beatrice Arduini SLN 20932, 5 cr., taught in English

This course is devoted to one of the most fascinating and influential masterpieces of Western literature, Dante Alighieri's *Divine Comedy*. Dante's poem relates one man's journey from the dark wood of error to the vision of truth, but as readers we not only observe the pilgrim's journey through the afterlife, we participate in it as well, as we encounter questions about the nature of evil, the possibility for spiritual improvement, and the experience of true happiness, and discover surprising parallels with our own time.

Italian 351 A - Contemporary Italian Culture

Italian culture from the 1980s to the present, with discussion of major events of the period and readings from fiction, political manifestos, song lyrics, etc. Emphasis on recent linguistic developments, changed role of women, meaning of multiculturalism in Italy, and the spread of global culture. Conducted in Italian. Prerequisite: either ITAL 203 or ITAL 234.

<u>Italian 402 A - Early Modern Italian Readings I</u>

Readings in Italian Quattro/Cinquecento, covering the period of the Renaissance. Prerequisite: ITAL 302.
