



Hoping to study a foreign language this winter?

- No prerequisites
- Covers 10 credits of Italian (the equivalent of 101 and 102) in one quarter
- Prepares students for ITAL 103 or for the Italian Studies in Rome & Rogliano program in spring quarter
- Great for students needing to meet the College of Arts & Sciences Foreign Language Requirement

High School Students

High school students can earn Italian or French Language credit in UW courses during the summer through the *Advanced Study Program*. Students take regular UW language courses taught by regular UW faculty side-by-side with regular UW and summer-only students.

Eligibility

The *Advanced Study Program* is designed for high-achieving students who have completed their high school freshman year by June 30. Applicants should have grade-point averages of at least 3.3 (B+). Applicants under the age of 16 and their parents will also be required to submit a Memo of Understanding that will be sent to them after the application is received.

Earning UW Credit

Each student enrolling for credit establishes a UW transcript. The grades earned in the *Advanced Study Program* are calculated into the overall grade-point average if a student later applies for and is accepted by the UW as a degree-seeking student. The credits can, in most cases, also be transferred to other colleges and universities. Some school districts grant students credit toward high school diplomas for the UW courses taken. For more information, a student or his or her parents should consult the student's guidance counselor regarding the district policy.
