- Please note that courses taken outside the department must be approved by the Graduate Program Coordinator prior to enrollment in order to be acceptable for fulfillment of requirements for the Masters in French.
- Proposals for independent study to fulfill graduate level requirements must be submitted in writing on the Independent Study Proposal Form to the Graduate Program Coordinator, who will determine whether the project is acceptable to fulfill one of the program requirements based upon your prior academic performance and the merits of the proposal.
